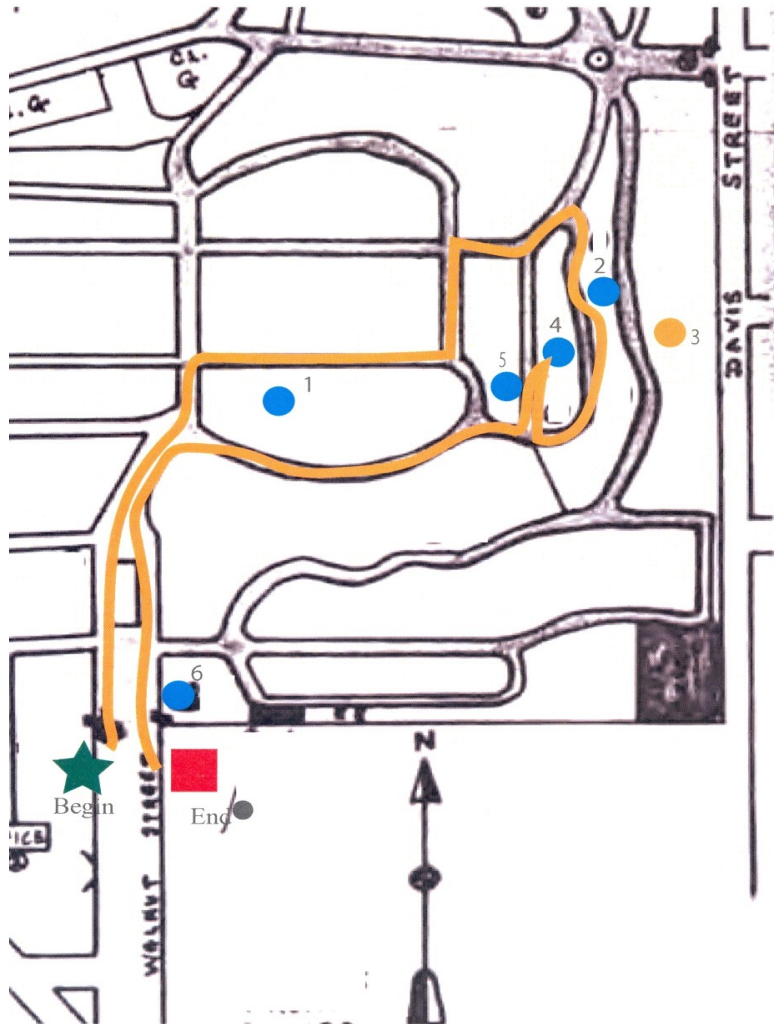


Woodlawn Cemetery 1200 Walnut Street, Elmira, NY
